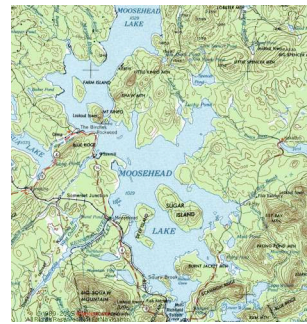


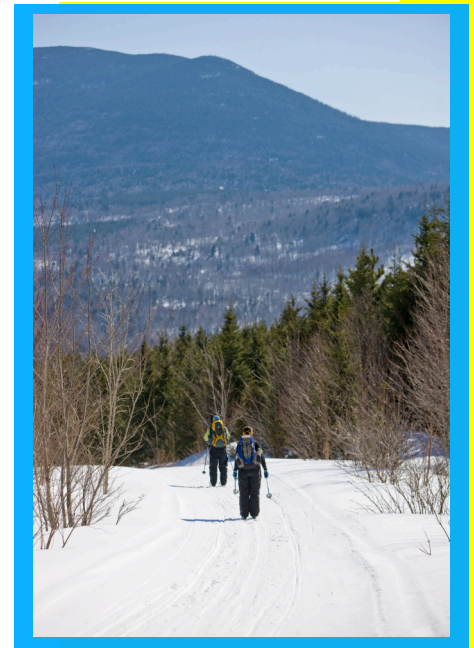
# Conservation and Recreation in Maine's 100-Mile Wilderness

Free and Open to  
the Public



The AMC's recent 29,500-acre purchase in Maine's 100-Mile Wilderness region creates a permanently protected 66,000-acre area and completes a 63-mile-long corridor of conservation land stretching from AMC's Katahdin Iron Works property near Greenville north to Baxter State Park. These lands are a part of the AMC's Maine Woods Initiative—the largest investment in AMC's history. AMC's Maine Policy Manager, Bryan Wentzell, will explain the opportunities and challenges of balancing new backcountry recreation, timber harvesting, wilderness lodges, and traditional recreation activities. Wentzell will also discuss Plum Creek's concept plan and its potential effect on development, recreation, and conservation in the Moosehead region.
